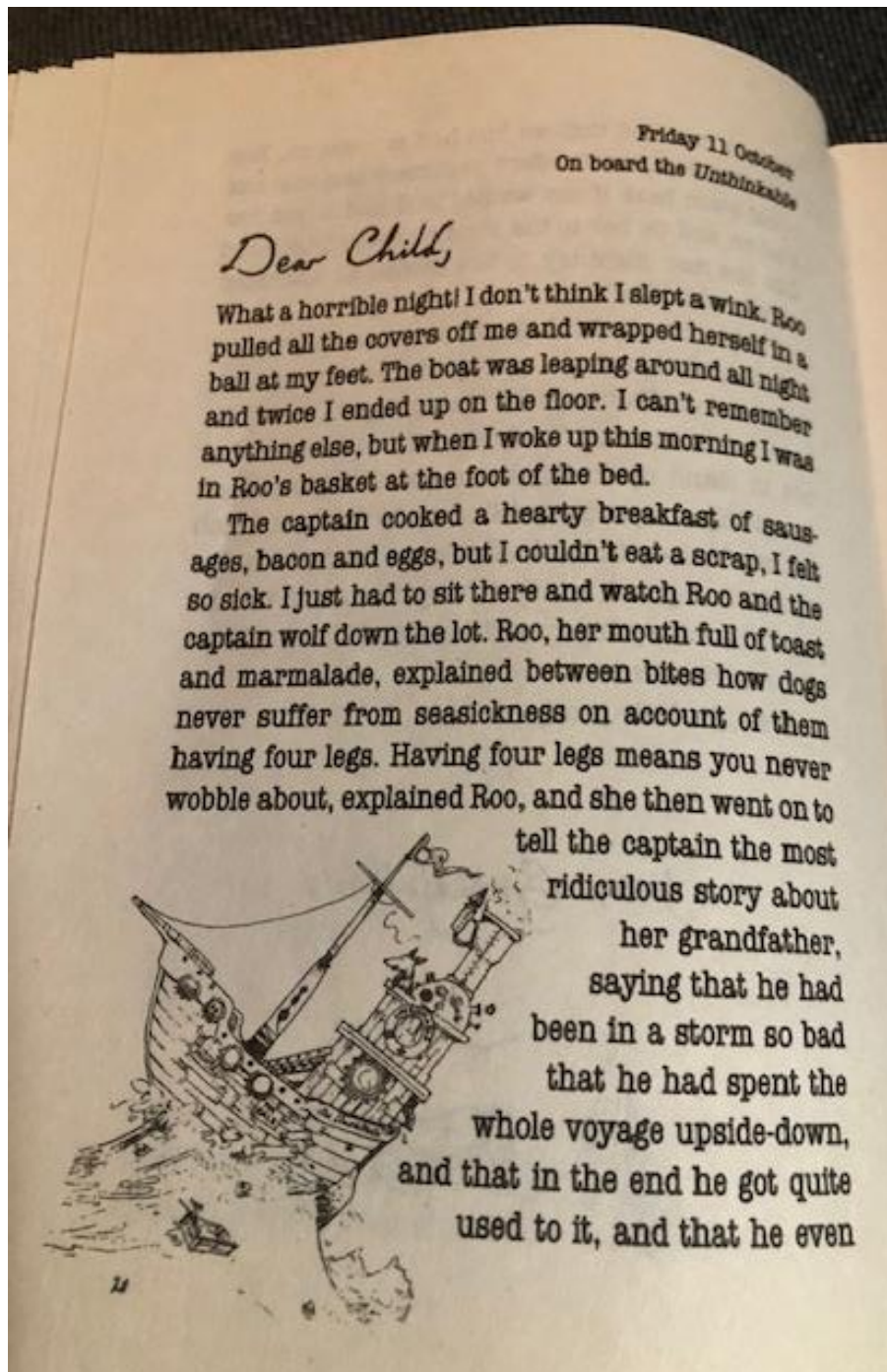


Read the chapter and answer the questions.
