

English

This term the children will be:

- Looking at the key features of instructional texts before creating their own. There will be some work on poetry and the children will be sure to enjoy our work on adventure and mystery stories.
- Expected to plan, write, edit and improve their work, proof read for spelling and punctuation errors and respond to marking.
- Reading as a class and individually. **Please listen to your child at home as often as possible and talk about their books.**

Maths

This term the children will be:

- Reading, writing, ordering and comparing numbers up to 1000. Finding 10 and 100 more and less than a given number. Counting from 0 in multiples of 1, 10 and 100.
- Adding and subtracting numbers using mental and written methods.
- Recalling and using multiplication and division facts for the 3, 4 and 8 times tables.

The children will be practising their number bonds and times tables regularly. Any practise they can do at home would be fantastic!

Science

This term the children will:

- Explore different types of rocks and soils.
- Learn about the right type and amount of nutrition as well as the function of skeletons and muscles.

Computing

This term the children will be:

- Brushing up on their word processing skills using Microsoft Word.
- Testing their programming skills as they create animated cartoons.

This term the children will:

History

Children will consider 'Who is Britain's Greatest Hero?' out of a selection of famous characters that have had an impact on British history.

PSHE

This term the children will be focusing on the topic of 'Me and My Relationships' and 'Valuing Differences' where they will consider their own strengths and weaknesses and how to express themselves respectfully.

D&T

This term the children will be:

- Developing their understanding of mechanical systems by creating lever and linkage mechanisms.



Art

This term the children will be:

- Working on painting and drawing skills based around the topic of Prehistoric Britain.

P.E

This term the children will have games lessons on Thursdays and the children will need a **suitable kit for outdoor games kit** (eg. joggers, t-shirt, sweatshirt and trainers – no jeans!) PE kits (white t-shirt, black or white shorts) should be kept in school ready for dance and gymnastic lessons.
