

### English

This term the children will be:

- Writing character descriptions, diary entries, instructions and their own stories.
- Focusing on maintaining the correct verb tense along with using adverbs, prepositions and conjunctions.
- Expected to plan, write, edit and improve their work, proofread for spelling and punctuation errors and respond to marking.
- Heard reading aloud during whole class reading sessions.

**Please listen to your child read at home as often as possible and talk about their books.**

### Maths

This term the children will be:

- Adding and subtracting numbers using mental and written methods.
- Reading, writing, ordering and comparing numbers up to 1000; finding 10 and 100 more and less than a given number; counting from 0 in multiples of 1, 10 and 100
- Trying to learn the 3, 4 and 8 times tables.

**The children will be practising their number bonds to 10 and 20, and their times tables regularly. Any practise they can do at home would be fantastic!**

### Science

This term the children will:

- Explore different types of rocks and soils.
- Learn about the right type and amount of nutrition.

### Computing

This term

- **We are digital experts** - Identifying that digital devices have inputs, processes, and outputs, and how devices can be connected to make networks.
- **We are animators** – Using still images to produce a stop-frame animation that tells a story.

### History

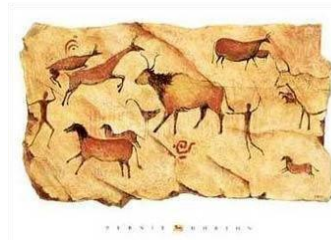
Children will learn about:

- The changes in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age.
- Food and hunting in the Stone Age.
- Tools in prehistoric times.
- Animals of the past.
- Homes in prehistoric Britain.
- Famous Stone Age sites.

### Art

This term the children will be:

- Working on digital art and drawing skills based around the topic of Prehistoric Britain.



### PSHE

This term the children will be focusing on the topic of relationships where they will consider their own strengths and weaknesses and how to express themselves respectfully.

### D&T

This term the children will be:

- Developing their understanding of mechanical systems by creating lever and linkage mechanisms.



### Music

This term the children will be:

- Exploring written music.

### P.E

This term the children will have games lessons on Thursdays and the children will need a **suitable kit for outdoor games kit** (eg. joggers, t-shirt, sweatshirt and trainers – no jeans!) Their indoor PE kits should remain in school.
