Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Building on previous skills, we continue to encourage the children to:

- *Come into school happily and being confident to try new activities.
- *Care for the classroom resources and take responsibility for keeping the classroom tidy and safe.
- *Play and learn co-operatively, taking turns and sharing with others.
- *Demonstrate good behaviour, being able to follow the classroom rules and understand the reasons for them.
- *Wear something spotty for Children in Need and discuss how the money we have collected will be spent.

Our whole school value this term is 'Hope'.

Physical Development The children will;

- *Continue to go for walks around school and the immediate environment - linked to seasons/weather.
- *Use the wheeled toys and pirate ship.
- *Take our learning outside where possible.
- *Work on strengthening their hands eg. by playing with construction toys to develop small finger movements and hand gym where we strengthen the whole hand to improve pencil grip and control.
- *Continue to work on correct formation of letters and numbers.
- *Use scissors focusing on accuracy and safety.
- *Learn what happens to their bodies before, during and after PE.
- *Be encouraged to be independent when changing for PE lessons, putting coats on, doing coats up, putting hats, scarfs, gloves on etc.
- *Continue to have a weekly Games session with Atlas Sports.
- *Continue to have a weekly PE lesson and Yoga lesson.

Literacy

Our topic 'Story Worlds' allows the children to explore, compare and contrast a variety of traditional and contemporary stories. We will also look at non-fiction books as well as developing other Literacy skills. We

- *Read and become familiar with the structure of various stories including: The Gingerbread Man, The Three Billy Goats Gruff, Room on the Broom and The Gruffalo.
- *Write character descriptions together.
- *Learn the Nativity story in order to perform it.
- *Use non-fiction books to find out information.
- *Continue with 'Essential Letters and Sounds' every day reading, spelling and writing skills. Focus on blending and segmenting simple words.
- *Continue name tracing.
- *Continue mark making/early writing activities.
- *Write Christmas cards.
- *Read individually twice a week, and within classroom activities every day.
- *Continue to learn Harder to Read and Spell words on flash cards in home and at school.
- *Continue to learn Phase 2 and Phase 3 sounds at home and at school.

Expresssive Arts and Design In Music the children will:
