#### **Early Help Offer**

### What is Early Help?

"Early help means providing support as soon as a problem emerges, at any point in a child's life, from the foundation years through to Year 6".

At Hempsted C of E Primary School we understand that, at times, family life can be challenging. We recognise that there may be situations where you need extra help and support. Our Early Help Offer identifies the need to help our children and families as soon as problems start to emerge, or when there is a strong likelihood that problems will develop in the future.

The Gloucestershire Early Help and Targeted Support Service is made up of local teams of professionals (including school) who deliver practical advice and support to children, young people and their families.

#### The Early Help Offer is an approach not a service.

Our aim is to promote the safety, well-being and resilience of all children and their families, so that they are able to be happy, healthy and meet their true potential.

We want all our children and young people, including those with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND), to achieve the best possible outcomes and receive the support they need when they need it most.

- All of our teachers are available in a pastoral capacity and parents are welcome to talk to them to discuss their child's wellbeing. If you need more than a quick word, please contact the school office to arrange an appointment or to ask for the teacher to give you a call.
- We also have a Pastoral Team who work closely with our children and families. Our Pastoral Lead, Mrs Subryan, is available every morning at school drop off for you to discuss any concerns or if preferred arrange a time for a private conversation.
- Sometimes families may need a family support worker to help them through a challenge. We can make a referral to Early Help, request an Early Help Coordinator attends a 'Team Around the Family' meeting, or phone Early Help for advice.
- ➤ The school Pastoral Team in partnership with the Parish Pastoral Team run a weekly 'Coffee and Chat' for parents on Tuesday morning in the Lyson's Hall. All parents and little ones are welcome.
- ➤ We work closely with the Hempsted Parish Children and Families worker who supports children in school and is also able to some support to our families outside of school.
- ➤ We have access to a therapist who can come into school to work with children who need extra support. If you are concerned about your child's mental health, please speak to Mrs Subryan.

➤ We are a 'Trail Blazer School' and have a Mental Health Support Team' that provides early care for children and young people who may be experiencing mild to moderate or early symptoms of mental health problems, which tend to be outside the scope of traditional NHS services.
