- can establish good relationships with children whilst setting firm boundaries
- is sensitive to the social and emotional implications for children
- will identify children's strengths and targets to help build their development
- is supportive and keen to work as a part of a dedicated team and be involved in village school life
- is sympathetic to the needs of a Church school and its vital community role and will support and enhance our Christian values
