

English

Writing - This term the children will be looking at the key features of traditional stories. They will continue to plan, write, edit and improve their work, proof read for spelling and punctuation errors and respond to marking. They will be constantly reminded to use full stops and capital letters at all times and on the correct placement of letters in joined handwriting.

Reading - The children will continue to read in class from our class reading books. Please listen to your child at home as often as possible and talk to them about their books.

Homework – Buzz words and spellings will continue on a weekly basis.



Maths

In Maths, the children will recognise and show equivalent fractions with small denominators. They will also be adding and subtracting, comparing and ordering fractions with the same denominator.

Children will practice telling the time to the hour, half hour and quarter of an hour before moving on to tell the time to the nearest 5 minutes and then the nearest minute.

The children will then look at angles in shapes or as turns, identify horizontal, vertical, parallel and perpendicular lines. They will draw and make 2d and 3d shapes.

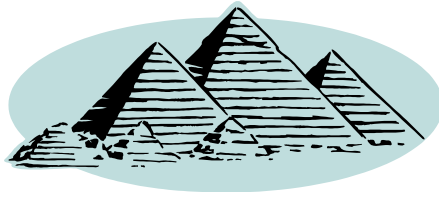
The children will be measuring, comparing, adding and subtracting mass (kg/g) and volume/ capacity (l/ml).

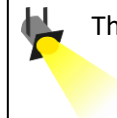
Art/ Design and Technology

Art - The children will sculpt their own Egyptian style pieces of work.



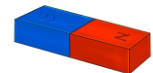
D.T. - The children will learn about seasonal food & cooking.
